Artistic Directors



DEBORAH HIRSCH

Now in her 8th season with the Houston Pride Band, Deborah Hirsch is originally from Baltimore, Maryland. She graduated from the University of Kansas with a bachelor's degree in music therapy and music education

and earned a master's degree in music at Texas A&M University-Commerce. She also served in the 312th Army Band in Lawrence, Kansas before moving to Texas.

Retiring after 37 years as a band director in Pasadena, Texas, Deborah enjoyed a successful career in public education. Ms. Hirsch was named "Teacher of the Year" in 2014.

As a participant the Colorado University Conducting Symposium in June 2016 Ms. Hirsch studied under Steve Davis, Dr. Donald McKinney, Dr. Matt Roeder and Dr. Matthew Dockendorf. In June 2019, she attended the Conn-Selmer Institute where she was able to study, consult and collaborate with many of her band idols—Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser, Dr. Paula A. Crider, Frank Troyka, Michael Sweeney and Richard Saucedo. In the 2019, Deborah was honored to direct the Association of Private Lutheran Schools Honor Band and the Texas Region 19 Class CC Band. In November 2021, she was the guest clinician for the Texas Region 19 CCC Band and shared the podium at the Bigger and Brighter Conference of the Pride Bands Alliance.

Deborah is an active clinician, judge, and consultant across the state and is a member of Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, Women Band Directors International, and Texas Music Adjudicators Association.

Ms. Hirsch is also a member of the chancel choir and bell choir at Bering Memorial United Church of Christ and a long time member of Pasadena Little Theater.

DAVID LEA

David Lea is in his eighth season as a member of the Houston Pride Band, and has served as Co-Artistic Director since 2018. Since joining the artistic team, David has conducted the Houston Pride Band at the



Women Band Directors International conference in 2022 as a featured concert and clinic ensemble, and served on the Artistic Team for the Pride Bands Alliance national conference in 2021. He has also represented HPB as a guest conductor for the Houston Chamber Music Society Wind Project. After bringing two world premiere performances to the HPB Audience in 2023, David is excited to be working with composer JaRod Hall to commission a new work to culminate the band's 45th season.

David is also a founding member of BrassTax, the Houston Pride Band Brass Quintet. BrassTax has performed throughout Houston as a musical ambassador for HPB's outreach initiatives, and will be featured as a guest collaborator this season with Pride Chorus Houston. Outside of BrassTax, David also plays trumpet for the NFL Houston Texans' Deep Steel Thunder.

David currently serves as the Head Band Director and fine arts department chair at Null Middle School in Sheldon ISD. His bands have enjoyed successes at UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Evaluations, and local and regional festivals. As a private trumpet teacher, his students have made Michigan All-state, earned first divisions at regional and state solo & ensemble contests, and had the honor of participating in the Michigan Youth Arts Festival.

David earned bachelor's degrees from Texas A&M and Michigan State University in Psychology and Music Education, respectively. He earned his Master of Music Education from the University of North Texas. His professional memberships include Texas Music Educators and Texas Bandmasters Associations.



ALL I WANT FOR CHRISTMAS IS YOU

Written and recorded by Mariah Carey in 1994, the uptempo modern classic All I Want for Christmas is You has gone on to become a staple of the holiday season. The song was a success when first released, reaching number six on the Billboard Hot Adult Contemporary chart. The advent of music streaming has led to renewed success for the single, which now annually re-enters charts worldwide in the weeks before Christmas and has reached number one for four consecutive years. The single has broken the record for the longest gap between release and reaching number one, 25 years apart. The song has sold 16 million copies worldwide, making it the number 11 best-selling digital singles of all time.

ANOTHER NIGHT BEFORE CHRISTMAS

Another Night Before Christmas is a parody on the original poem by the UK's Poet Laureate, Carol Ann Duffy, a Scottish poet and professor of contemporary poetry at the Manchester Metropolitan University. The story is about a little girl who wants to see Santa Claus to prove to herself that he is real, but falls asleep at a critical moment. The music's composer Philip Lane is an English composer and musicologist. He first composed an orchestral setting of the original poem 'Twas the Night Before Christmas in 2007, which was recorded by actor Stephen Fry and the BBC Concert Orchestra to wide acclaim. He followed in 2009 this composition to complement Professor Duffy's Another Night Before Christmas, which was similarly recorded by actor Simon Callow and the RTÉ Concert Orchestra.

AULD LANG SYNE

As we look toward a new year in 2024, it seems appropriate to include Auld Lang Syne as part of this year's program. Based on a Scots poem written by Robert Burns, it is one of the best-known melodies in English- speaking countries, the title may be translated into English idiomatically as "long ago" or "old times." Tonight's performance is an adaptation of the version performed by the world-famous instrumental ensemble Mannheim Steamroller created by Chip Davis.

HOLIDAY DELIGHT

Holiday Delight offers a fantastic new take on "O Holy Night" and other classic tunes. Composer Caleb Hammer (b. 1995) hails from Kalamazoo, Michigan and currently resides in Austin, Texas. He has studied composition at Western Michigan University. Of this piece, the composer said:

In my mind, there is no more enjoyable time of the year than the holiday season. I love the colors, joy, the family, and, of course, the food. My favorite song from this season is "O Holy Night". Although arranging is not the focus of my composition career, I love this tune and I wanted to create a brand new work around the thematic ideas of this song (with a couple thematic calls to other classic holiday tunes).

HOW THE GRINCH STOLE CHRISTMAS

Of all the Dr. Seuss stories, possibly none is more delightfully charming than How the Grinch Stole Christmas, the take on that mean old man who disliked Christmas so much that he stole all the presents, the toys and the Christmas trees. As should befall any villain, he is transformed and his heart "grew three times its size." This medley includes music from the 1966 animated special, including two songs with lyrics by Dr. Seuss: "Welcome Christmas" and "You're a Mean One, Mr. Grinch."

MINOR ALTERATIONS NO.2

Minor Alterations No 2: Carols from the Dark Side is a sequel to the popular *Minor Alterations: Through the Looking Glass* by Dallas-based composer David Lovrien (performed by Houston Pride Band in 2016). The composer boasted that this second installment is "31% more twisted", featuring even more favorite Christmas tunes reimagined in the minor mode while also being mashed up with classical orchestra music. While there are too many twisted variations to list, just listen for the wicked mashup of "O Holy Night" and Wagner's *Ride of the Valkyries*!

ON AN OLDE ENGLISH CAROL

The "Coventry Carol" is one of those rare Christmas carols that is not full of light and hope. It is a dark lullabye, mourning the loss of the children who were put to death as King Herod attempted to find and kill the prophesied King of Israel. On an Olde English Carol is a setting of this beautiful, melancholy melody. The work begins with the voices of the mourners singing the souls of their children to sleep ("Lully, Lullah, Lully, Lullay"). Regarding his composition, composer Randall Standrige said, "I wanted to create a christmas work that used very reserved orchestration to allow beautiful instrumental colors to shine through and to create a sense of isolation and tension." The grief of the parents culminates in a powerful statement at the climax of their work, before returning to a quiet whisper, though the work ends on a slight ray of hope that crescendos to the final release.

STARS AND STRIPES FOR CHRISTMAS

For those who love both traditional band marches and Christmas Carols, Stars and Stripes for Christmas is perfect for you. In this hilarious mashup, arranger Robert Foster has intertwined beloved holiday songs such as "Jingle Bells", "Hallelujah Chorus", "We Wish You A Merry Christmas and "Angels We Have Heard On High" into John Philips Sousa's march *The Stars And Stripes Forever*.

THE TOY TRUMPET

Composer Raymond Scott is known for a prolific career composing film music in the middle of the 20th century. While he didn't specifically compose for animation, many of his works were adapted for the classic Looney Tunes cartoons. One of his signature tunes, The Toy Trumpet, was famously sung by Shirley Temple in the 1938 film "Rebecca of Sunnybrook Farm", and versions by The Boston Pops and Al Hirt have become classics of instrumental holiday music.

A VAUGHAN WILLIAMS CHRISTMAS

In addition to his contributions to both orchestra and band literature, prolific English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams was also one of the foremost researchers/collectors of traditional folk songs, and also collected many traditional carols as well. The medley A Vaughan Williams Christmas features three such carols that Vaughan Williams adapted and harmonized: "Forest Green (O Little Town of Bethlehem)", "Wassail Song", and "Sussex Carol".

YOU BETTER SLEIGH!

The idea for You Better Sleigh! came when composer JaRod Hall was approached by a Houston-area band director to see if he would compose "a sassy, jazzy, holiday piece." You Better Sleigh! plays on two terms: a "sleigh"-which is inarguably very winter-themed here in the States-and "slay"-which has evolved to encompass many definitions, mostly centered on the theme of doing something extremely well. The latter definition pays homage to both the LGBTQIA+ and Black communities-popularized by drag culture. The style of the piece is funk, an entire genre of music pioneered and popularized in 1960s America by Black musicians, most notably James Brown. What makes funk really dance is the bass line and percussion grooves, typically complex in nature. Mr. Hall has slipped in snippets of various holiday tunes hidden throughout the piece - try to listen for them all.



Guest Antists

NANCY FORD GUEST EMCEE

Nancy Ford was bitten by the show-biz bug when she was three years old, appearing on "Rumpus Room", a cheesy little television variety show out of Youngstown, Ohio. She played the "Adorable Child Sitting on Santa's Lap." Since then she has performed in comedy clubs, theaters, galleries, churches, and dives throughout the United States.

LGBTQ+ media has published Nancy's work since 1988, including her award-winning column, WHAT A WORLD. As an interviewer, she has engaged high-profile personalities including Bette Midler, Diane Keaton, Betty Buckley, Harvey Fierstein, Bea Arthur, Judy Collins, Melissa Etheridge, and countless others. She continues to write for diverse clients including the Montrose Star, an internationally distributed energy magazine, a men's underpants designer, and more.

SAÏD HENRY PRESSLEY NARRATOR

Saïd Henry Pressley previously appeared with Houston Grand Opera as a Jailer in *Tosca*, Hyde in *Prince of Players*, Voice of Sweeney Todd in *Sweeney Todd*, Ned in *Its a Wonderful Life* and The Messenger in *La Traviata*. He also appeared in the company world premiere of *The Pastry Prince*, and *Cinderella in Spain*. Other notable roles include Presto in *Les mamelles de Tirésias*, Simone/Maestro Spinelloccio in *Gianni Schicchi*, and Wu Tianshi in the American premiere of Peter Maxwell Davies's *Kommilitonen!* Don Alfonso in *Così fan tutte*, Sebastian in the world

premiere recording of Lee Hoiby's *The Tempest* (Albany Records), Balthazar in *Amahl and the Night Visitors*, and Sarastro in *The Magic Flute* with Purchase Opera. Pressley performed in *Unsung Activist* by Steve Wallace with Opera in the Heights and has appeared with The Dacameron Opera Coalition. With Houston's Transitory Sound and Movement Collective, he has performed at the Madison Museum of Contemporary Art and MATCH Houston. He won first prize in the Tony and Sally Amato Opera Competition (2010); second prize in the Harlem Opera Theater Competition (2013); and was named a semi-finalist in Dallas Opera Guild's Annual Vocal Competition (2014) and Best Vocalist at the Sid Wright Accompanying Competition (2018). A graduate of Purchase College Conservatory and The Juilliard School, he is pursuing a doctorate degree at the Butler School of Music.

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

With Pride Bands Alliance, members of the Houston Pride Band have been able to participate at every Gay Games, several Presidential Inaugurations, and conferences throughout the world.
