ARTISTIC DIRECTORS

DEBORAH HIRSCH

Artistic Director

Now in her 7th season with the Houston Pride Band, Deborah Hirsch is originally from Baltimore, Maryland. She graduated from the University of Kansas with a bachelor's degree in music therapy and music education and earned a master's degree in music at Texas A&M University-Commerce. She also served in the 312th Army Band in Lawrence, Kansas before moving to Texas.

Retiring after 37 years as a band director in Pasadena, Texas, Deborah enjoyed a successful career in public education. Ms. Hirsch was named "Teacher of the Year" in 2014.

As a participant the Colorado University Conducting Symposium in June 2016 Ms. Hirsch studied under Steve Davis, Dr. Donald McKinney, Dr. Matt Roeder and Dr. Matthew Dockendorf. In June 2019, she attended the Conn-Selmer Institute where she was able to study, consult and collaborate with many of her band idols-Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser, Dr. Paula A. Crider, Frank Troyka, Michael

Sweeney and Richard Saucedo. In the 2019, Deborah was honored to direct the Association of Private Lutheran Schools Honor Band and the Texas Region 19 Class CC Band. In November 2021, she was the guest clinician for the Texas Region 19 CCC Band and shared the podium at the Bigger and Brighter Conference of the Pride Bands Alliance.

Deborah is an active clinician, judge and consultant across the state and is a member of Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, Women Band Directors International and Texas Music Adjudicators Association.

Ms. Hirsch is also a member of the chancel choir and bell choir at Bering Memorial United Church of Christ and a long time member of Pasadena Little Theater.

DAVID LEA Artistic Director

David Lea has been an Artistic Director for the Houston Pride Band since 2018. He joined the ensemble in 2016 and has previously served as trumpet section leader. When he's not conducting, he continues to play in the trumpet section and is a founding member of Brass Tax, an HPB brass quintet.

David earned bachelor's degrees from Texas A&M and Michigan State University in Psychology and Music Education, respectively. He earned his Master of Music Education from the University of North Texas. He has performed and participated in conducting symposiums with Drs. Kevin Sedatole and Craig Kirchoff, Dr. Matthew Westage, Michael Votta and Frank Battisti.

David is currently the Director of Bands at Michael R. Null Middle School in Northeast Houston. His bands have enjoyed successes at UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Evaluations, and local and regional

festivals. As a private trumpet teacher, his students have made Michigan All-state, earned first divisions at regional and state solo & ensemble contests, and had the honor of participating in the Michigan Youth Arts Festival. His professional memberships include Texas Music Educators and Texas Bandmasters Associations. David is an outspoken advocate for his LGBT+ students and was honored to support them by serving as the founding faculty advisor for a student organization focused on inclusion, acceptance, and community.

PROGRAM NOTES

SPARKLING LIGHTS

The traditional Christmas carol *O Christmas Tree* originated in the 16th century folk Song *Ach Tannenbaum*, which received modern lyrics in the 19th century as O Tannenbaum. The theme has been used in a variety of settings, both holiday oriented and not. It is notably the melody of *Maryland*, *My Maryland*, their official state song. This setting transforms it from the typically stately presentation into an energetic, dynamic fanfare. Shifting meters, contemporary harmonies, and driving percussion all contribute to this modern take on an old familiar piece for the season.

Matt Conaway is an American composer, arranger and educator. Mr. Conaway is an award-winning, internationally-known composer for concert bands, with over fifty original works currently in publication. His compositions range from very beginning through very advanced, based on his experience working with all levels of performers in grade 5-12, collegiate, and professional ensembles. He has received commissions from many schools and honor bands in the last five years.

SO WONDROUS BRIGHT

This setting of a Puerto Rican carol for concert band initially gives the effect of a smaller, more intimate traditional ensemble. Various combinations of instruments, colors, textures and rhythms are explored, showcasing the many sonic colors available with concert band instrumentation.

Carol Brittin Chambers is an American composer, educator, and arranger. Chambers is the owner and composer of Aspenwood Music, where she is commissioned each year to compose and arrange works for concert band, marching band, and various other ensembles, including The Crossmen Drum Corps. In addition to marching music, Chambers also enjoys writing works for concert band, solo instruments, and small ensembles. She was most recently named the winner of the 2019 WBDI (Women Band Directors International) Composition Competition.

SNOW IN A SILENT WOOD

From its peaceful, solitary opening to its powerful statements of majesty and grandeur, "Snow in a Silent Wood" is a dramatic, moving work that provides great opportunities for musical and expressive development. An excellent choice for performances year-round or during the holiday season. Jonathan McBride currently teaches K-12 band, choir, and general music in the small town of Pateros, Washington.

I SAW THREE SHIPS

This arrangement of a beloved classic combines original material with the memorable theme, creating a joyful, rich, and unexpected version of the traditional English carol. Musicians and audiences alike will enjoy the light and active woodwinds above the more powerful low brass. Colorful percussion scoring completes this holiday tapestry.

Heather Hoefle is an American educator and composer. Her 30-year career as a band director has included experience in a variety of settings, with the majority of her experience has been with beginning and middle school bands. Heather's composition career came out of a desire to produce music for her own students. Much of her work has met the printing press after being vetted by her own bands. In addition to being a full time band director, she fulfills commissions and works as a clinician throughout the country.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM FROZEN

Hailed as one of Disney's best animated films ever, *Frozen* is quickly establishing itself as a classic with a heartwarming story, stunning visuals and magnificent songs. This impressive concert medley features *Vuelie*, *Do You Want to Build a Snowman?*, *For the First Time in Forever*, and *Let It Go*. This arrangement for concert band was created by composer Sean O'Loughlin who is the Principal Pops conductor for the Victoria Symphony Orchestra in British Columbia.

TOBOGGAN

JaRod Hall is a Texas-native educator, performer, and composer. JaRod's bands have received consistent sweepstakes awards at the Texas University Interscholastic League Concert and Sightreading Evaluations, as well as being recognized at the state level.

Mr. Hall says of his composition:

"A toboggan is a long narrow sled used to slide downhill over snow or ice. The music tells the tale of an epic race down the biggest hill in the neighborhood. As the day begins, the first few snowflakes begin to fall, depicted by the solo bells that start the piece. As the flurries continue to fall, the snow builds and the tempo picks up, kids begin pouring out of their homes to prepare for the race. While outside, they witness several snowball fights emerge around the neighborhood. The race begins atop a snow covered hill as the children speed toward the finish line. French horns pave the way through the middle section by illustrating the gorgeous landscape as the racers smoothly slide through the soft snow -- a beautiful clear sky on the horizon. As the finish line pops into view, the racers frantically fly through the course, dodging stray snowballs overhead in an exciting finish."

A MOST WONDERFUL CHRISTMAS

We now present a joyous medley of contemporary holiday favorites arranged by Robert Sheldon, the Director of Concert Band Publications at Alfred Music Company. Included are holiday favorites "Winter Wonderland", "I'll Be Home for Christmas", "Santa Claus is Comin' to Town", "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas", and "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year". We're sure you will enjoy this aptly-titled work *A Most Wonderful Christmas*.

OF THE SILENT NIGHT BEGOTTEN

Of the Silent Night Begotten is a more contemplative setting of the Christmas evergreen Silent Night. Composer Matthew R. Putnam uses recurring original music as the glue that holds the setting together and then combines its lush flowing material with the beautiful carol for a lovely effect. Matthew Putnam is a band and choral director, composer, educator, and arranger. He has been teaching music in the North Carolina public school system for over 27 years, most recently being named the Polk County Middle School Teacher of the Year in 2019. Over the course of his career, Matt has written hundreds of custom arrangements and compositions for middle school, high school, and college bands across the country. Matt also enjoys being an active drill designer for marching bands.

ON WITH THE SNOW!

Sleigh Ride; Winter Wonderland and Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow! make up this sparkling medley; which features all of the sections of our band! Sing along with us as we celebrate the holiday season together!



IN THE CHRISTMAS MOOD

Inspired by Glenn Miller's famous big band hit "In the Mood", this toe-tapping holiday medley brings together some of the 20th century's most popular songs and carols. Wrapped up in the big band style, you can listen for "A Holly Jolly Christmas", "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer", "Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow!", "Frosty the Snowman", and "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree."

John Wasson is an award-winning composer, arranger, performer and conductor whose works have been performed by the Gatlin Brothers, Tim McGraw, Tony Bennett, Harry Connick, Michael Bolton, Reba McIntyre, Frank Sinatra Jr., Mel Torme, Joel Gray, Liza Minelli and Bob Hope. Wasson studied at the University of North Texas where he earned degrees in Music Theory and Trombone Performance. For over 30 years he has been associated with the Dallas Brass both as a charter performing member and as primary composer/arranger of many works in their extensive repertoire.

OLD SCOTTISH MELODY

Old Scottish Melody ("Auld Lang Syne") is a song by Robert Burns (1759- 1796). The title, when translated literally into English, means as 'old long since', but translates as 'days gone by'. It is one of the better-known songs in English-speaking countries, and sung at the stroke of midnight on New Year's Day. Like many other frequently sung songs, the melody is better remembered than the words, which are often sung incorrectly, and seldom in full. This 1976 setting is by Dr. Charles A. "Pete" Wiley (1925-1992) longtime band director at Lamar University in Beaumont.

DASHING THROUGH THE SNOW

Based on *Jingle Bells*, here is a merry romp through hills and fields as Richard Saucedo uses a mixture of meter changes, exciting fanfares, unique harmonic and melodic twists, and a sense of joy in this marvelous setting for the holiday season. Saucedo is currently the Fine Arts chairman and Director of Bands at Carmel High School in Carmel, Indiana.


