# **ARTISTIC DIRECTORS**

#### **DEBORAH HIRSCH**

Artistic Director

Now in her 6th season with the Houston Pride Band, Deborah Hirsch is originally from Baltimore, Maryland. She graduated from the University of Kansas with a bachelor's degree in music therapy and music education and earned a master's degree in music at Texas A&M University-Commerce. She also served in the 312th Army Band in Lawrence, Kansas before moving to Texas.

Retiring after 37 years as a band director in Pasadena, Texas, Deborah enjoyed a successful career in public education. Ms. Hirsch was named "Teacher of the Year" in 2014.

As a participant the Colorado University Conducting Symposium in June 2016 Ms. Hirsch studied under Steve Davis, Dr. Donald McKinney, Dr. Matt Roeder and Dr. Matthew Dockendorf, In June 2019, she attended the Conn-Selmer Institute where she was able to study, consult and collaborate with many of her band idols-Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser, Dr. Paula A. Crider, Frank Troyka, Michael

Sweeney and Richard Saucedo. In the 2019, Deborah was honored to direct the Association of Private Lutheran Schools Honor Band and the Texas Region 19 Class CC Band. In November 2021, she was the guest clinician for the Texas Region 19 CCC Band and shared the podium at the Bigger and Brighter Conference of the Pride Bands Alliance.

Deborah is an active clinician, judge and consultant across the state and is a member of Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, Women Band Directors International and Texas Music Adjudicators Association.

Ms. Hirsch is also a member of the chancel choir and bell choir at Bering Memorial United Church of Christ and a long time member of Pasadena Little Theater.

#### DAVID LEA Artistic Director

David Lea has been an Artistic Director for the Houston Pride Band since 2018. He joined the ensemble in 2016 and has previously served as trumpet section leader. When he's not conducting, he continues to play in the trumpet section and is a founding member of Brass Tax, an HPB brass quintet.

David earned bachelor's degrees from Texas A&M and Michigan State University in Psychology and Music Education, respectively. He earned his Master of Music Education from the University of North Texas. He has performed and participated in conducting symposiums with Drs. Kevin Sedatole and Craig Kirchoff, Dr. Matthew Westage, Michael Votta and Frank Battisti.

David is currently the Director of Bands at Michael R. Null Middle School in Northeast Houston. His bands have enjoyed successes at UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Evaluations, and local and regional

festivals. As a private trumpet teacher, his students have made Michigan All-state, earned first divisions at regional and state solo & ensemble contests, and had the honor of participating in the Michigan Youth Arts Festival. His professional memberships include Texas Music Educators and Texas Bandmasters Associations. David is an outspoken advocate for his LGBT+ students and was honored to support them by serving as the founding faculty advisor for a student organization focused on inclusion, acceptance, and community.

# **PROGRAM NOTES**

#### ALSO SPRACH ZARATHUSTRA

Richard Strauss (1864-1949) was one of the great postromantic German composers. His most notable achievement was the development of the tone poem - an extended, free fantasia on an extramusical theme.

The fanfare from "Also Sprach Zarathustra" is one of Strauss' most widely performed and easily recognized excerpts. Zarathustra is based upon the Nietzsche poem of the same name which expounds the doctrine of superman. The opening motive appears throughout the piece as a unifying device.

#### JUPITER: THE BRINGER OF JOLLITY, from "The Planets"

The Planets is an orchestral suite - what composer Gustav Holst called, "a series of mood pictures" - where each movement depicts one planet. The suite contains seven movements: although eight planets were known to exist (Pluto had not yet been discovered, much less demoted), Earth is at the center in the astrological scheme.

*Jupiter, the Bringer of Jollity*, features a moving but unhurried bright melody.

Gustav Holst (1874-1934) was a classical British composer. Born into a musical family, he played piano and violin, and began composing when he was about twelve. He served as a church organist and choirmaster. When neuritis in his right hand forced him away from the organ he took up the trombone and succeeded as an orchestral musician. Holst was influenced by socialism, and attended lectures by George Bernard Shaw with whom he shared a passion for vegetarianism. He became deeply interested in Hindu philosophy and learned Sanskrit. He dabbled in astrology, and read astrological fortunes until his death. He was appointed Director of Music at St. Paul's Girls School in Hammersmith. He became interested in old English folksongs and Tudor composers. Holst's compositions for wind band guaranteed him a position as the medium's cornerstone, as seen in the many present-day programs featuring his two Suites for Military Band.

#### **STARLIGHT**

Display a broad pallet of sonic colors in your concert hall. A light and spritely opening evokes images of darkening night

skies as one by one the stars appear. Soon, as with the ever growing stars, the instrumentation grows into an expansive landscape, filling the halls with sounds as colorful and full as a clear starry night. Then, just as it started, the sounds begin to fall off, gradually fading out just as the stars before the approaching day. Stunningly beautiful!

#### **JOURNEY THROUGH ORION**

Julie Ann Giroux was born in 1961 in Fairhaven, Massachusetts, and raised in Phoenix, Arizona and Monroe, Louisiana. She received her formal education from Louisiana State University and Boston University. She studied composition with John Williams, Bill Conti and Jerry Goldsmith, to name a few. Julie is an accomplished performer on piano and horn, but her first love is composition.

Ms. Giroux says of Journey Through Orion:

"Photographs from the Orion Molecular Cloud Complex, simply put, are out of this world. Pictures of the Great Orion Nebula, Barnard's Loop, M78, M43, the Molecular Clouds 1 & 2 (OMC-1, OMC-2) and The Horsehead Nebula never cease to capture my imagination. I have journeyed there many times in my mind, so I decided to sketch that journey with notes. Travel with the music 1,500 light years away into the constellation Orion the Hunter, into the Molecular Cloud Complex and through the Great Orion Nebula where Stars and Ideas are born."

#### THE IMPERIAL MARCH (Darth Vader's Theme)

Composed over 40 years ago, this deliciously sinister theme for Darth Vader remains one of the most recognizable musical compositions in movie history. This authentic-sounding version captures all the feeling of dread and impending doom of the original.

John Williams (b. 1932) has composed the music and served as music director for more than one hundred films. His 40-year artistic partnership with director Steven Spielberg has resulted in many of Hollywood's most acclaimed and successful films, including Schindler's List, E.T.: The Extra-Terrestrial, Jaws, Jurassic Park, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, four Indiana Jones films, Saving Private Ryan, Amistad, Munich, Hook, Catch Me If You Can, Minority Report, A.I.: Artificial

Intelligence, Empire of the Sun, The Adventures of TinTin and War Horse. Mr. Williams has composed the scores for all seven Star Wars films, the first three Harry Potter films, Superman: The Movie, among many others. Mr. Williams has received five Academy Awards and 50 Oscar nominations, making him the Academy's most-nominated living person and the second-most nominated person in the history of the Oscars. His most recent nomination was for the film Star Wars: The Force Awakens. He also has received seven British Academy Awards (BAFTA), 22 Grammys, four Golden Globes, five Emmys, and numerous gold and platinum records.

#### SHOOTING STARS

This dynamic and challenging new work from Richard Saucedo is filled with rich musical imagery. The opening section features prominent roles for alto and soprano sax soloists while the percussion section provides a pulsating ostinato accompaniment. After a beautiful lyric section, the fast pace returns with antiphonal tradeoffs, culminating in a bombastic statement from the entire ensemble.

Mr. Saucedo is a freelance arranger and composer, having released numerous marching band arrangements, choral arrangements, and concert band and orchestral works. His compositions have been performed by middle school and high school bands all over the world, as well as by college and university groups. *Nocturne*, his first work for orchestra, was named most outstanding new composition at the 2009 National Orchestra Cup Festival at Lincoln Center. His most recent orchestra work, *Essay #1*, was premiered at the 2014 Midwest Clinic.

#### LULLABY TO THE MOON

Brian Balmages (b. 1975) is an award-winning composer and conductor. His music has been performed throughout the world with commissions ranging from elementary schools to professional orchestras. World premieres include prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, and Meyerhoff Symphony Hall. His music was also performed as part of the 2013 Presidential Inaugural Prayer Service, which was attended by both President Obama and Vice President Biden. He is a recipient of the A. Austin Harding Award from the American School Band Directors Association, won the

2020 NBA William D. Revelli Composition Contest with his work *Love and Light*, and was awarded the inaugural James Madison University Distinguished Alumni Award from the School of Visual and Performing Arts.

Mr. Balmages says of Lullaby to the Moon:

"Many works of fiction portray the moon as a living being. Particularly in children's books, one can find countless illustrations of the moon with a face on it, experiencing a wide array of emotions. This piece was written from the perspective of the "living moon" - alone in space while looking at the Earth. The music portrays the sometimes lonely feeling of the moon, away from all the life on Earth. There are also moments of comfort as the moon proudly watches over us, almost as a parent watches over his or her children from a distance. Despite feeling alone throughout the day, the moon emerges at night to light the sky and make us feel safer on those darkest of nights. This lullaby is my own personal way of returning the favor."

#### BLUE MOON

Blue Moon was the featured song in the 1937 Hollywood Musical motion picture "Hollywood Hotel." With music by Richard Rogers and lyrics by Lorenz Hart, it has become a popular jazz standard throughout the years.

#### STAR TREK THROUGH THE YEARS

For over 50 years, the television and movie franchise started by the Star Trek television series in the 1960s has inspired audiences with its positive interpretation of the future and dynamic science fiction storytelling. One of the biggest legacies of Star Trek has been its contribution to the lexicon of film and television music. In an era when many television series relied on simple piano scoring, all seven Star Trek series have used full orchestras and film-style scoring to enhance their presentation. The Star Trek film series has attracted well-known composers such as Jerry Goldsmith, Dennis McCarthy, Jay Chattaway, Michael Giacchino, and Leonard Rosenman, and earned two Academy Award nominations.

This arrangement of *Star Trek Through the Years* features the main title themes from three television series (Star Trek, Deep Space Nine, and Voyager) and two feature films (Star Trek Generations and The Motion Picture).
